Dear Parent/Carer,

I am pleased to welcome all students back to school following the Summer break, especially those joining us in year 7 and year 12.

I take great pride in being the Headteacher of this tremendously popular and highly successful school. The school is committed to ensuring that every young person realises their potential in a welcoming and caring environment, which is underpinned by the Catholic values outlined in our Mission Statement.

At Cardinal Langley, we have high expectations of all of our students and appreciate the high level of support we receive from parents and carers. This year we are particularly focusing on the pride that students take in their academic work, appearance and behaviour and I am sure I can rely on your continued support throughout this academic year.

At the start of the year there are a number of items which I would like to draw to your attention.

Uniform

Students are proud to attend Cardinal Langley and the vast majority of students reflect this in their high standard of uniform. Over the past year, however, we have noticed an increasing problem with sports shoes being worn and we wrote to all parents/carers at the end of the last academic year. The school has a clear policy on footwear and I would like to again remind you that shoes should be plain, black "leather" with no sports logos and **not Converse, Vans, Nike or Adidas**. This was reinforced to students through Form Tutors and assemblies at the end of the last term. Any student who has incorrect footwear will be expected to have this rectified by **Monday 7th September**.

Another Excellent Year for GCSE and A-level Results!

This Summer saw another outstanding set of GCSE and Sixth Form results and these are a testament to the motivation and commitment of the students, and the support and encouragement of staff, parents and carers.

At GCSE, 74% of students achieved 5+ A*-C grades with 58% achieving the benchmark including English and Maths. The percentage of A*/A grades has increased from 21% to 22% and the proportion of all GCSE grades at A*-C was 77% which is 8% above the national average. This is an excellent set of results and reflects the hard work and dedication shown throughout the exam preparations.

In the Sixth Form we achieved 98% pass rate at A-level with 41% of all grades A*-B. Performance in vocational subjects was again outstanding with the average grade being a Distinction* which places us in the top 10% of providers nationally. These outstanding results were key to ensuring that students were able to fulfil their ambitions of either gaining a place at the university of their choice, starting an apprenticeship or entering employment. We wish all of our students every success for the future.

I am sure that, with continued hard work and the commitment of students and their teachers, we will be celebrating even greater success in 2016.

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance is essential to your child's academic success. The school aims for 100% attendance with an overall rate of at least 96% expected. Attendance levels below 90% give us serious cause for concern.

In September 2013, the discretion for Headteachers to be able to grant term-time absence for up to ten days was removed under changes to education regulations and Headteachers are no longer able to grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are 'exceptional circumstances'.

The new law does not give any entitlement to parents and carers to take their child on holiday during term time and the school is not permitted to grant term-time absence for family holidays and other similar recreational activities.

Punctuality to school and to lessons is also important, as it is indicative of a student's general motivation and commitment towards school. If your son or daughter has a long journey to school, please make sure that they leave in sufficient time to allow for traffic conditions or delays to the buses or trains.

If you do need to request leave of absence for your child during term time, please fill in a Term-Time Absence Request Form and return it to Student Services in the School Office, giving sufficient notice.

Unauthorised absence is recorded and may result in intervention by the Education Welfare Service and the issue of a Penalty Notice. For more information, please refer to our Attendance Policy and the Local Authority's Penalty Notice Protocol, available from the school website.

Road Safety

There is a temporary 20 mph speed limit in effect outside of school during the time when the school crossing patrol is in operation. This is part of the Local Authority's policy for incident reduction and road safety. Please do not park in the disabled bays or obstruct the cycle lane or drives and entrances to neighbouring houses and buildings.

Learning Resources Centre

The Library/Learning Resources Centre (LRC) operates a "Breakfast Club" before school from 7:15am to 8:15am every morning, as well as offering support to students with their homework and independent study and providing a quiet environment for those who simply enjoy books and reading.
