ViVO Rewards

The ViVO system enables teachers to reward students for their hard work with 116,767 being awarded in 2018/19. All students have access to their points total and the reason for them being awarded, either through the ViVO website or by downloading the app. ViVO points can be exchanged for rewards or donated to one of the charities that the school supports.

School Meals

The cost of a standard meal-deal has increased to £2.20, with effect from 1st September 2019.

Many children in the UK are entitled to free school meals but often parents are not aware that they are eligible or they choose not to claim their entitlement. We would like to encourage parents and carers to apply for free school meals for their child for two main reasons: your child can select a good-quality and healthy lunch each school day using the school's cashless catering system, and the school can claim a Pupil Premium for every child receiving their free school meal entitlement. This additional funding helps us to provide a wider range of opportunities and learning experiences for your child.

Parking & Road Safety

As always, we urge parents and carers to take care when dropping off or collecting their child from school by car. Please do not park on pavements, or in bus bays or the cycle lane, or blocking neighbours' drives, or anywhere you might be causing an obstruction – especially near the school entrance and the school crossing patrol.



Please do not use the visitor car park as a drop off and collection point, **unless you require it for disability access**, as this is causing congestion on the school grounds and potentially putting children at risk, as well as adding to traffic problems on Rochdale Road.

Attendance & Punctuality

Good attendance is essential to your child's academic success. The school aims for 100% attendance with an overall rate of at least 96% expected. Attendance levels below 90% give us serious cause for concern. Changes to regulations came about in September 2013. Headteachers may only authorise term-time leave in exceptional circumstances and are no longer permitted to authorise leave of absence for family holidays, including family celebrations that involve an extended stay or an extension to a school holiday period, or other recreational activities during term-time. Please bear this in mind when planning your 2019-20 holidays and family events. Unauthorised leave is recorded and may result in the issue of a fixed penalty notice.

Punctuality to school and to lessons is also important, as it is indicative of a student's general motivation and commitment towards school. If your son or daughter has a long journey to school, please make sure that they leave in sufficient time to allow for traffic conditions or delays to the buses or trains.

If you do need to request leave of absence for your child during term time, please fill in a Term-Time Leave of Absence Request Form and return it to Student Services in the School Office, giving sufficient notice.

School Bus Service

An **igo pass** is required for children aged 11-16 to pay the concessionary fare on public transport within Greater Manchester. It costs £10 and lasts until 31st August after a child's 16th birthday. More information about igo passes can be found at: http://igo.tfgm.com/

Please note: Bus drivers can and do refuse to issue a concessionary fare to a child without the correct pass.

Our Pass is the new bus pass for 16-18 year olds. For a one-off £10 administration fee, it unlocks free bus travel covering all local bus services across Greater Manchester. It can be used 7 days a week and has no time restrictions for bus travel, not just making getting to school, college, work and training easier, but also going out with friends and exploring Greater Manchester!
