Remote Learning

Teachers have been delighted with the transition to remote learning by all of our pupils. Attendance and engagement in lessons has been excellent and long may this continue! As we spend longer in this way of working, we will adjust to ensure the very best experience for our children. We recognise that live lessons and daily interaction with teachers is key to learning but also that five hours per day facing a screen is not ideal. In Key Stage 3, we will introduce more variety where the curriculum will be delivered through a mixture of live lessons, flip learning (research tasks etc), recorded lessons and set tasks. This will enable students to experience the curriculum in a much more realistic way when compared to classroom learning. We will still require the pupils to log on to every lesson and be registered. In Key Stage 4 and 5, we will continue with live lessons for all and review this in two weeks.

GCSE & A-level Grades

We are awaiting more detailed guidance on how GCSE and A-level grades will be calculated this year and will be in touch regarding any developments as they happen.

Free School Meals

You are probably aware that the national free school meal voucher scheme is to be reinstated. We hope to be able to offer vouchers for the final three weeks of this half-term from the week beginning 25th January 2021. The vouchers will be to the value of £15 per eligible student per week and we expect that they will be delivered for the three-week period in one code to minimise the number of times families need to access the Voucher Site to convert codes to vouchers.

For next week, we will continue to offer food packages. If your child is currently in receipt of free school meals please contact school using <u>admin@clrchs.co.uk</u> by Tuesday 19th January if you would like to collect a weekly food parcel on Thursday 21th January.
