

COVID Catch Up Funding Proposed Spending 2020/21

The EEF guide is designed to help teachers and school leaders support their pupils, by equipping them with an overview of relevant evidence. It is designed in particular to support and inform decisions about how to use catch-up funding announced in June 2020. It is not anticipated that schools will adopt all of the suggestions included. Rather, it is assumed that schools might prioritise a small number of approaches best suited to their context, balanced with the strength of evidence.
