
Inspired by Faith, Education Leads to Progress

Alongside this, 13 Year 9 students went on an exciting workplace visit. They went to Chadwick's of Bury with Miss Green and our Enterprise Advisor, Mr Nugent, to see how a world leading business in heat-sealing pre-cut lids operates.

Members of staff at Chadwick's discussed different careers available at their business and routes possible to get the qualifications required. Students watched a video created by degree apprentices at Chadwick's explaining their experience learning on the job whilst studying for their degree. Students then had a tour of the factory, looking at the different parts of the production line and learning the process of manufacturing heat-sealed pre- cut lids.





















Year 8 students had the opportunity to join Sr. MaryJohn in an art class. They designed wooden anchors and wrote prayers as part of a cross-curricular session.

Bus Fares and Igo Passes
